Ethics Teachers Required



Dear Parents and Carers,

Volunteers Needed to Continue Our Ethics Classes

Philosophical ethics classes are now available in NSW public schools as an option for students who are in Non-Scripture classes. Primary Ethics is the organisation authorised by the NSW state government to deliver ethics classes under an approved curriculum from Kindy to Year 6.

Primary Ethics are constantly in need of volunteers to deliver and sustain the ethics program for your local school whether it is to maintain existing classes or starting new classes. Comprehensive training, access to lesson materials and classroom support are all provided. Previous teaching experience is not required.

Currently at our school we have 8 ethics classes and these are facilitated by volunteer ethics teachers. For various reasons, some of these teachers' circumstances have changed and they can no longer teach our children or can no longer take two classes. To make sure our classes can continue, we need a volunteers to replace them.

Ethics Teachers facilitate discussion using training and material provided by Primary Ethics. Teaching and its required preparation would take no more than 2 hours per week and includes a commitment to take a class for half an hour on Wednesday mornings during school terms.

An opportunity is also available for a critical supporting role of Ethics Coordinator for those who could not commit to a weekly fixed time ethics class as our current coordinator is moving on.
