The Beecroft Public School P&C is a group of volunteers who work together to support teaching and learning. This Wednesday 20 February the P&C will be hosting their first P&C meeting of the year. At 7:00p.m. the P&C will be welcoming new parents to our school with drinks and nibbles in the new walkway playground followed by the first meeting of the year at 7:30p.m. in the OC classrooms. Please join us on the night to share in the community spirit that exists and to learn about the many great things happening at our school.

Improvements to our School's Physical Environment - It's the hall's turn to have a makeover

The P&C has continued to partner with the school to support to the school community and students in many ways. The P&C has worked proactively with the school to improve the physical learning spaces at Beecroft Public School. In the last year, two new play and learning spaces have been created and the hall sound and lighting system has been upgraded thanks to funding and volunteer labour of the P&C.

This week a further upgrade to the hall, through departmental funds, has begun with the installation of new sustainable lighting, ceiling repairs and repaint. Later in the term, the hall floors will be sanded and polished. The final work in the hall will see the curtains cleaned and the front curtains replaced. The hall will be closed for the next two weeks as this initial work is carried out. Thank you to Garry Burgess who has cleared the area so that this work can begin and to Julie Tracy who has negotiated with our many hall users, who have been very accommodating. It will be great to see another well-used area of our school rejuvenated.

Parent volunteers – Service to our students

Each week our school is extremely fortunate to have parents, grandparents and caregivers volunteer in a myriad of positive ways. If you serve at the canteen, uniform shop or in student banking we thank you. If you help students in literacy or numeracy groups we thank you too. If you serve on a P&C committee, supervise band rehearsals or help out with the greening of our school we are most grateful. Volunteers not only serve our students but show our children that volunteering and service are important and enriching pursuits.

What do our volunteers need to do to keep our children safe?

To meet national and state requirements, we require all parent volunteers to complete a Working with Children Check (WWCC) <u>declaration</u> form (known as Appendix 5) together with a 100 point identification check in the office. *Please note: close relatives, such as grandparents, who have direct links with a student's family, come under the term 'parent' in WWCC context.* Appendix 5 forms are obtainable through the front office and we have also included a copy in this newsletter for your convenience. If you plan to volunteer at school, please complete Appendix 5 and return it to the office with 100 points of identification when you next visit the school. If you completed a WWCC declaration at our school last year, you do not need to redo your WWCC declaration (your status remains current whilst your child is enrolled at Beecroft Public School). Special Religious Education (SRE) and Special Education in Ethics (SEE)

SRE and SEE lessons, commonly known as Scripture and Ethics, begin this Wednesday. All students will go to their classrooms at 9:25a.m. so the roll can be marked prior to moving to the SEE and SRE at 9:30a.m. for 3 - 6 and 10:15a.m. for K - 2 students. These lessons are provided by volunteers, in accordance with departmental policy. In cases where there are not enough volunteers, students will attend non-scripture for this time. Parents will be notified of this change.

Organisation of SRE/SEE is very complicated, so I would like to acknowledge and thank Mrs Irene Robbins and Mrs Deirdre Familton for their comprehensive organisation and leadership. If any parents would like to make inquiries regarding SRE/ SEE, please feel free to speak with Mrs Robbins or your child's classroom teacher. Thank you to our many dedicated volunteers who teach SRE and SEE at Beecroft Public school.

3 - 6 Swimming Carnival – Wednesday 27 February

Please make sure you have carefully read the Swimming Carnival information and have completed the online entry form. Students will only be allowed to leave the carnival with a parent, if this has been pre-arranged in writing prior to the carnival. Ensuring students are accounted for, as we move to and from the pool and school, is a priority. Any parent who has sought approval in writing to take their child from the carnival must also sign their child out at the attendance desk, located on the bridge, from 2:00p.m. on the day. If your child is in a relay he/she will need to remain at the pool until the relay has concluded.

Keeping our Students Safe- Out in the Sun

From the beginning of August until the end of May in Australia, sun protection measures are required. At school we make use of our shaded spaces where possible, ask students to wear their wide-brimmed hats at all times when outside and remind students to apply sunscreen. Please teach your child/ren to apply sunscreen at home and send a small child friendly bottle of sunscreen with your child for use at school. Each teacher will be provided with a container of sunscreen for emergencies. If your child is not allowed to apply sunscreen, please alert the classroom teacher.

Keeping our students safe- Before and After school

If you come to school with your child/ren in the morning, please help us to establish habits that ensure all our students' safety. Please encourage your children to be in the right spot at the right time.

Before 8:55a.m. - There is no teacher supervision. Students will be directed to the 3 - 6 quadrangle.

8:55a.m. to 9:10a.m. - Please bring your child/ren to the 3 - 6 basketball courts where a teacher is supervising, as there is no teacher in the K-2 quadrangle.

9:10a.m. to 9:25a.m. - Students are dismissed and can move freely between the K - 2 and 3 - 6 quadrangles and the basketball court under teacher supervision.

In the afternoon - Students are not to be left in the school grounds unsupervised. Please ensure your child/ren's safety by having a plan for afterschool supervision.

2019 Premier's Reading Challenge

The 2019 Premier's Reading Challenge is starting soon! Would your child like to be involved? The Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) is a NSW government initiative that "aims to encourage a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students, and to enable them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition but a challenge to each student to read, to read more and to read more widely. The Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) is available for all NSW students in Kindergarten-Year 9, in government, independent, Catholic and home schools." - <u>https://online.det.nsw.edu.au/prc/home.html</u>

The PRC runs from *Monday 4 March* to *Friday 30 August, 2019*. Students can choose to take up the Challenge at any time between the start and finish dates, though older students in particular should ensure they leave enough time to read their books before the finish date! **Participation is voluntary, not compulsory**, but we do strongly encourage students of all reading abilities to enter (including students not yet able to read on their own). *Students in years K-2 can participate by having books read to them by an adult – they do not need to be able to read the books independently.*

Points to note:

- Mrs Hahn and I will be reading PRC books with K-2 students during their weekly visits to the library. As per last year, we will be entering the reading records online for **Kindergarten classes only** and this will be done throughout the year
- If students from years 1-6 wish to participate, they and their parents/carers are responsible for entering their books online by the closing date of 30 August 2019
- Students in Years 1-6 can login to the PRC with their usual Department of Education username and password. Younger students may not yet know these details: if your child is unsure of their username or password, they will need to speak to their teacher.

All students who officially complete the Challenge receive a certificate at the end of the year, and may have their names published on the PRC Honour Roll. Please let us know if you do **not** wish your child to officially participate in the PRC. You can view the PRC rules at https://online.det.nsw.edu.au/prc/rules.html.
